There are 32 common classroom commands in Spanish.The classroom instructions / commands included are:(Verbos Imperativos 2a persona singular T)Abre, busca, cierra, colorea, complete, comienza, copia, dibuja, escribe, entrega, escoge, escucha, guarda, habla, lee, levanten la mano, levntate, marca, mira, muestra, para, pega, pon, practica, pregunta, presten atencin, recorta, repite, responde, saca, sintate, termina.We also have them in the following conjugation:(Verbos Imperativos 2a persona plural USTEDES)Abran, Busquen, Cierren etc.We have FOUR versions of each poster:Posters Version 1: T commands (ideal for one-on-one)Posters Version 2: USTEDES commands (ideal when referring to the entire class)Posters Version 3: T commands with English translationPosters Version 4: USTEDES commands with English translationEach poster has the classroom command written in Spanish at the top with a cartoon showing that action below it.These posters are ideal as a part of your Back to School decoration. The posters are titled as Instrucciones Bsicas (Basic Instructions) instead of using the Spanish words Mandatos de la clase. In this lesson, we will learn to use verbs in the imperative tense for making classroom commands in Spanish and giving instructions in the class. You will listen to the examples of things the teacher would say in the Spanish class and practice with quizzes. Lets begin We will begin this lesson with a short video showing 10 basic verbs that are often used in the classroomfor classroom commands and instructions in Spanish Mandatos/Instrucciones. This video includes pictures representing each verb and a few important notes on how to use them. You can activate the captions in English (cc) below. Dont worry if you cannot understand everything, as we will explain more details later. As shown in the video, verbs like HABLAR, ESCRIBIR, LEER and ESCUCHAR are really common when communicating with your teacher or classmates in Spanish. Particularly for the classroom, these verbs will be used in the imperative in Spanish, a tense that is used to give orders or express wishes. The imperative will only beused for pronouns in the second person such asT, USTED, VOS, VOSOTROS, USTEDES. The chart below shows how to form the imperative in Spanish of regular verbs. Notice that each verb in infinitive has a different ending (AR, ER, IR). The chart shows that Hablar will change to Habla for the pronoun T, e.g. T habla primero (You speak first!). PronounHABLAR (to talk)ESCRIBIR (to write)LEER (to read)THablaEscribeLeeUstedHableEscribaLeaVosHablEscribLeVosotrosHabladEscribidLeedUstedesHablenEscribanLean Most of the time, instructions and classroom commands in Spanish will begin with a verb in imperative. This means that when giving instructions like Open your book , the teacher will not say Ustedes abren sus libros (regular conjugation of ABRIR) but (Ustedes) abran sus libros.It is not necessary to add USTEDES before Abran and actually we will omit it most of the time. Teachers will frequently use the imperative for the pronoun USTEDES (you) to refer to the whole class. In books, you will probably see the imperative form for the pronoun USTED so instead of (Ustedes)Completen el ejercicio, as the teacher would indicate inclass,you books instructions in Spanish will likely say (Usted)Complete el ejercicio. In most cases, Spanish classroom commands and instructions will include these verbs: ABRIR (to open), SELECCIONAR (to choose), ESCUCHAR (to listen), MIRAR (to look), COMPLETAR (to complete), LEER (to read), CORREGIR (to correct), RELLENAR (to fill in), BUSCAR (to look up/to find), HABLAR (to talk), LEER (to read), PLANEAR (to plan), DISCUTIR (to discuss), ESCRIBIR (to write), RESPONDER (to answer) and PRACTICAR (to practice). All these verbs will change their ending according to the chart presented above, except for CORREGIR that will change to CORRIGI(A)N and PRACTICAR to PRACTIQUE(N). The imperative for regular verbs is not that difficult to remember with some practice because the pattern is somewhat predictable. However, not all the verbs in the language follow rules. That being said, you will find Spanish irregular verbs in the imperative mood, such as Vaya (You go), Ven (You come) and Sea (Be). This topic is really interesting, so we will continue learning about it in future lessons.
