He perseveres and ultimately earns enough athletic credit to become a letter man too. Danny is a loyal friend to Kenickie and drives for him when Kenickie gets a concussion. He is a great driver with nerves of steel and wins the race, bringing glory to the T-Birds and to Rydell as a whole. He also wins the dance-off at the graduation dance, but what he really wants is another opportunity to convince Sandy that he loves her. He decides to change his image from greaser to prepster, and presents a far more clean cut appearance to her, hoping that this will make her view him as the kind of boy she wants to date. Tough and abrasive, Rizzo is the leader of the Pink Ladies. She is seemingly emotionless and cold and can be unkind when she wants to be, which seems to be often. She deliberately engineers a surprise reunion for Sandy and Danny knowing that it is likely to be a complete disaster. He is unable to drive and has to relinquish the driver's seat to Danny. Kenickie is in love with Rizzo and is hurt when the two break up. He tries to make her jealous by bringing Cha Cha to the graduation dance, but ultimately he and Rizzo are reunited after she lets him know that she is not pregnant after all. Frenchy doesn't like high school so she drops out and enrolls in beauty school instead. She finds that she does not have as much aptitude for this as she had hoped and has a mishap in hair color class, accidentally coloring her own hair bubblegum pink. This leads to an epiphany when her guardian angel appears to her and tells her to go back to high school, which she does, and she ultimately graduates with everyone else. Frenchy is the ultimate romantic and wants Danny and Sandy to end up together and live happily ever after. She is also the nicest of the girls to Sandy, her friendship is genuine and her attempts to include her in the Pink Ladies heartfelt and intentional. While Grease is one of the most loved films of all time, the version weve been watching on screen for the past four decades is vastly different from how the musical was conceived. Grease started out in 1971 as a much grittier and raunchier stage show, written by Jim Jacobs and Warren Casey, which eventually went to Broadway. Yahoo Entertainment talked to Jim Jacobs ahead of the films anniversary (it was originally released on June 16, 1978) and walked down memory lane about how it all started. The film Grease was based on a much grittier stage musical of the same name. In 1970, Jacobs came up with the idea for a Broadway show. He pitched it to his best friend, Warren Casey. Warren said, Thats a really good name for it would be Grease, because the guys used all that grease in their hair at the time. The food was greasy. Then there were the guys in the neighborhood that had the cars looking like grease monkeys. They started writing; the first scene they finished was the girls pajama party. Not long after, Jacobs was substitute-teaching at an acting class He asked the students to do a cold read of the pages he and Casey had crafted. They started to read the scene, and the people who were not in the scene, they were laughing hysterically. The bulb went off in my head I went, Holy crap! We really have something. The film Grease cost \$6 million to make, but the first theatrical production cost \$171. The very first theater production of Grease premiered at the Kingston Mines in Chicago, formerly a vacated trolley barn, which sat only \$171. According to Jacobs, Sixty-one dollars, I remember, was for a 51 Chrysler, a real car, which they drove on stage, and everyone in the audience was dying from carbon monoxide.
