Posted in: Blog, Installation, Rear-Facing Seats Move the front seats up as far as possible so you have lots of room to work in the back seat. If possible, recline the vehicle seat where the rear seat will go before starting your installation. Make the seat upright once you've finished. This will help you get the seat installed tightly. Pull the seat belt or latch belt from inside the car seat, not from outside the seat. This means that if you've dropped the latch bell, it should fall down on top of where the child goes, not outside the car seat. The rule applies to most car seats except for the following British Classic convertible models, older Britax conversion (i.e. Marathon, Boulevard, Roundabout, Decathlon-those that add up to 40 or 65 lbs) Chicco KeyFit and KeyFit30 Recaro Signo Sunshine Kids Radian models Put your weight on the base whenever you pull the seat belt or latch belt tight. Do not just use a hand on the base, this generally won't be enough weight! To get the seat installed tightly. In this photo, Alisa has her left knee in the base and her right foot on the ground. If you're short and flexible, like all three Car Seat Ladies, you can probably get your foot in the base-this works even better. Put weight on the right side of the seat, and then the left side, then the right side again, etc., as you pull the latch belt or seat belt tight. This will help you get the belt as tight as possible. In the photo, see how Alisa is pushing with her hand and her knee on the right side of the base. After she pulls the latch strap, she'll move her knee into the left side of the base and push there as she pulls more slack from the latch strap. Unless you are installing a Chicco Keyfit, pull the latch strap or the seat belt from inside the base, as Alisa is doing in the photo. To tighten the seat belt or latch belt, go behind the car seat, between the car seat and the front seat. Use your stomach to push the car seat into the back of the car and sway from side to side as you pull the seat belt or latch belt tight. You will have to lean over onto the car seat. Note how Alisa is leaning over onto the car seat and pushing it with her belly as she pulls the lower latch straps tight. Also note that the vehicle seat is very reclined. She will move the vehicle seat upright after she has installed the car seat. If you don't fit behind your rear-facing convertible seat or if you don't want to use your belly to push the car seat into the vehicle seat, you can stand or kneel beside the car seat and push down with one hand on the seat (put your other hand where your baby's bottom would go) and pull the latch strap with the other hand. Sway there a few times until you get the car seat completely tight. The following videos illustrate many of the tips above and may help you get a tight, secure installation. By law, children must be buckled up in a child car seat made for their height and weight. A rear-facing seat is set at an angle to support your child's neck in a sudden stop or crash. Before installing the child car seat, read the sections of your vehicle owner's manual and child car seat user manual that describe how to install child car seats. There may be a child car seat clinic in your community that can help you install your child car seat. On this page Checking the fit of the harness Adjust the harness straps so they are at or just below your child's shoulders. Some child car seats allow you to either raise the harness height by moving up or down. If your child car seat has built-in locking clips, follow the instructions on the child car seat for using the clips. Attach the hooks or connectors to the UAS lower anchor bars. As you push down on the child car seat or on the removable base, tighten the UAS strap. Option 2: seat belt Use the seat belt if you cannot use the UAS lower anchorage bars, if you are using your infant car seat without its base or if there are no lower anchorage bars in your vehicle. Infant seats installed without the removable base must be secured with the seat belt. A locked seat belt will help keep the child car seat tight after you have installed it. Your child car seat may have built-in locking clips, follow the instructions on the child car seat for using the locking clips. Check your vehicle owner's manual to learn how to lock the seat belt. Pull the shoulder belt portion out completely, hold onto it before you pass the seat belt through the recommended path. This will lock the belt in most vehicles. Check the label on the child car seat for the correct path for the seat belt. Note that convertible child car seats have two paths for the belt – one for rear-facing mode and one for forward-facing mode. Insert the tongue into the vehicle seat belt buckle before releasing the seat belt. Grab the vehicle seat belt near the buckle and tighten the seat belt by pushing down on the child car seat and pulling up on the shoulder belt. Check the angle of the child car seat. See the section below to check to make sure your rear-facing seat is installed correctly. Helpful hints If your child car seat has a removable base, pushing down on the base with your knee as you tighten the vehicle seat belt or UAS strap will help you get a tighter fit Check often as your child grows that the child car seat is still at the recline position recommended by the manufacturer Items that didn't come with your child car seat, such as seat protectors or comfort pads, may not be safe to use Checking to make sure your rear-facing seat is installed correctly Make sure the rear-facing seat is at the right recline angle for the weight of your child. Look for this information on the child car seat or in the child car seat user's manual. There may be an indicator on your child car seat to help you adjust the angle. When checking the angle of the child car seat, park your vehicle on a level surface To protect the child's airway, make sure the rear-facing car seat is within the angle range indicated on the child car seat or in the user's manual Try to install your child car seat as tightly as possible, to keep your child safer in a sudden stop or crash: Grab both sides of the child car seat where the seat belt or UAS belt is threaded through the child car seat or base Try to move the child car seat from side-to-side and front to back. It shouldn't wiggle around too easily. Pushing against the sides of the child car seat makes it harder to move. Once you think you've got it pretty snug, try to pinch the webbing of the harness at the collar bone. If you can't pinch it, the seat might be too loose. Tighten the seat belt or UAS strap further by consuming your own seat belt to your child's shoulders. Adjust the harness straps until they are snug on your child's shoulders. To make sure the harness straps are snug on your child's shoulders: Slide a finger under the harness at the collar bone and pull gently up/out; the harness should feel snug on your finger; or Attempt to pinch the webbing of the harness with the thumb and forefinger. If you are unable to pinch the harness, then it is sufficiently tight. Chest clip Attach the chest clip and slide it up to your child's armpit level. Give it a tug to make sure it is closed properly. Make sure to: Check that the harness is snug every time you place your child in the child car seat This is important when changing clothes for different seasons. Be sure to follow the manufacturers' instructions, and to re-adjust the harness for each use. Follow the steps above to make sure the harness is snug. When to move your child from a rear-facing seat to a forward-facing seat Rear-facing is the safest position for your child. Even if your provincial or territorial regulations allow you to move to a forward-facing seat, your child should keep using rear-facing seats as long as possible. When your child outgrows his or her infant seat, moving to a convertible seat will allow your child to stay seated rear-facing longer. It is okay if your child's legs touch the vehicle seat back. Step 5: Pull up the seat belt up to the furthest it can go until it is tight enough. In case of a crash, the seat will remain intact just as a Latch connector does. Step 6: In the case of a forward-facing car seat, never forget to connect the tether strap to the car's top tether anchor. This helps to lessen cases of injuries to your baby during a crash. When you face a challenge during installation, please check the manual for instructions. Bases are usually for convenience but not necessarily for safety purposes.
