Whether it's a mini-version of the Lord of Terror or a murloc-treasure goblin hybrid, there's a Diablo 3 pet out there waiting for you to adopt it. Half-Formed Golem Acquired via Rise of the Necromancer Purchase This beautiful boy can be purchased along with the new class in the Rise of the Necromancer pack. Gaudy necromancer in mismatched armor not included. Probe Acquired via Starcraft II: Legacy of the Void Collector's/Deluxe Edition Purchase Some alien probes are uncomfortable, but not this one. You can get this Protoss unit as a Diablo 3 pet by purchasing the collector's/deluxe editions of Starcraft II: Legacy of the Void. Pets Available Via Menagerist Goblin Drops in Diablo 3 The menagerist goblin is one of the rarest varieties of treasure goblin and its spawn rate is undifferent by difficulty. It's rare because it's a guaranteed, random, unowned non-combat pet for each member in the party. You don't have to worry about duplicates! This mob is definitely high priority if you want to finish your Diablo 3 pet collection. Blaze The perfect companion for a wizard, this flaming skull is likely an homage to Marvel's Ghost Rider. Rumor has it that if you idle long enough, Nicolas Cage's face briefly replaces Blaze's. Buddy While he's far from man's best friend, this pup is still your little Buddy. He'd appreciate tagging along with a necromancer to get in on some of that bone action. The Bumble This yeti is always ready to play Buck Bumble. How do you think this Diablo 3 pet got its name? Charlotte If you're into depressing children's literature about arachnids, this is definitely the pet for you. Friendly Gauntlett Perfect for snapping its fingers along to the Addams Family theme with you. Or for holding your hand on long walks through the cemetery. Galtrhak The Unhingedd You know this guy is down to party when he's just unleashing his jaw when devouring prey... Grunkk Grunkk is a miniature version of the Siegbreaker from Act III. Keep him away from your ynni-building! Haunting Hannah Hannah is hauntingly beautiful. Or maybe just hauntingly beautiful. Humbart Wessell While not as good as Blaze at riding motorcycles, Humbart is the champion of goofy names. Just don't let Zayl (Act V) know you took him. Lady Morthanlu Everyone's favorite lady god since that one lady god from Undertale, she's the perfect Diablo 3 pet for the adventurer with a taste for petting zoo animals with attitude. Lamb This non-combat pet is as cute as a mutton and also a human child. Whose child is this? Where are his parents? Malfesance Although this Diablo 3 pet has an air of horror and death around it, if you bond with it over the latest season of New Girl, it'll soon become your palfesance. The Mimic How come mimics only ever mimic treasure chests? Why not mimes? Mime-ics, anyone? Ms. Madeleine She may look like a character from a Korn album cover, but the flavor text describes her as "a happy go-lucky gal!" Overseer Lady Josephine The teddy bears in our world are happy and cuddly, but in Sanctuary, they're vengeful and hellbent. Still cuddly, though. Rocky Acquired via completing Season 9 Chapter 4 He's the best damned boxer who's also made of stone I've ever seen and he was available in Season 9. Blizzcon Pets Classic Diablo Acquired via Blizzcon 2016 Attendance/Virtual Ticket Blizzard brought back the classic Lord of Terror in travel size for Blizzcon 2016 attendees and virtual ticket holders. Murkublin Acquired via Blizzcon 2015 Attendance/Virtual Ticket Blizzard keeps finding ways to make cosmetic pets out of murlocs, and I'm all for it. This pet was available to Blizzcon 2015 attendees and virtual ticket holders. Event Pets Royal Galf Acquired via Wirt's Stash During Anniversary Event To unlock this beautiful bovine, players had to craft Wirt's Leg, decipher a map, solve a puzzle involving cow carcasses, and raid Wirt's Stash during the anniversary event. The Butcher Acquired via Level 1 Anniversary Event Dungeon Run This meat is extra fresh and was only available during the anniversary event. Players had to enter the cathedral and run the dungeon starting off at level 1 to get this baby boy. ... That's all the Diablo 3 pets in the game so far. These pets range from the adorable, like the yeti-themed pet The Bumble, to the grotesque, like – well, like almost every other pet. Gartrak the Unhingedd which is a demon that is mostly just a jay. The Barbarian's Grunkk, where they smoothed out the details of details of an Abomination. And let's not forget That Which Must Not Be Named, which is definitely not a reference to the cow level, because there is no cow level. There are a lot of these pets to obtain, but very few sources for them. Here's where you can go to find a probably-not-cuddly friend. The Menagerist Goblin The majority of non-combat pets drop from the Menagerist Goblin. Obtaining a pet from him is easy — it's a 100% drop for everyone in the party, every time he is encountered. Better yet, it's guaranteed that the pet is not a duplicate. You get a new, unique pet each time. He has 19 different pets, and will keep players coming back. Like every other treasure goblin, just find him, chase him, and beat him down for his loot. The downside is, he is a very rare spawn, so finding him is difficult. There is a silver lining for the moment: treasure goblins spawn twice as often this season. That will help increase how often he'll show up. It is important to note he has the same spawn chance on any difficulty. Don't worry about cranking it up to Torment, or expecting more reward for the extra struggle. If you want to farm him, run on a level you feel comfortable with. Throw YouTube up on another screen and go into mindless grind mode. Run the same level over and over. Just need to make a new game to refresh the mobs in the level. Many players have their farming route laid out, and debate which is the best path. The treasure goblin has 24 spawn locations throughout all the Acts of D3, so there are lots of spots to discuss. Lots of people recommend rerunning The Weeping Hollow in Act I. One Menagerist Goblin can spawn here. With the right build, this level can be cleared in as little as 30 seconds. This increases the number of attempts at finding a goblin in less time. This level has an extra bonus to it to, which we'll get to in a moment. Other people like to rerun Southern Highlands in Act I. In this level there is a cave called the Cave of the Moon. In both level 1 and level 2 of the cave, a Menagerist Goblin can spawn. That is two chances at the goblin, close to the same level. There is an excellent level to keep running to find this little not-pet. With all the other operating options of each routine take that, this one is one of the hottest of the hot spots. There are double the chance in this level, plus, general consensus indicates there is a higher spawn chance here. Or so the statistics report. This following route is a lot longer, but will hit the important spots. This has been deemed one of the fastest routes. Tower of the Damned -> Heart of the Damned Tower of the Cursed Core of Great Royal Crypts Cathedral -> Leoric's Passage Festering Woods Northern Highlands Southern Highlands -> Cave of the Moon Clan level 1+2 Once you have cleared all of these areas, restart the game and begin from the drop again. The Liv Moore pet Remember the suggestion to speed clear The Weeping Hollow in Act I over and over? There's a second reason to do that. There is one and only one other rare in D3 that is available to spawn at all times that is guaranteed to drop a pet. Ravi Lilywhite can spawn in The Weeping Hollow. The spawn rate is 1%, and he can spawn anywhere in the level. He ONLY spawns in Adventure Mode, not in Quest Mode. To find him, search and clear the entire map. If he is not there, exit and create a new game. Start anew, clear and search again. Of course, while searching for him, keep an eye out for The Menagerist Goblin as well. With the drop chance, it should take – on average – a hundred tries. With the right build on the character meant for speed and an easier setting, a full clear can be done in less than a minute. Spend an hour or two and this pet, along with a couple from the goblin, you have increased your pet collection. The pet from Ravi is Liv Moore, name after the lead character from iZombie. An interesting pop culture shout out to that show and/or comic. D3 Seasonal Pet Most seasons of D3 reward a non-combat pet. Previous seasons' pets cannot be obtained.
